
The Ministry of Jesus Summed Up! Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

Matthew 9:35-38



A shadow is all about how an object interacts with light. When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

John 8:12

Me and My Shadow So if Jesus is the light I am in the object (Absorber or Reflector) Then the shadow I cast will be a great indicator of my relationship with the light We are more interested in the "shadow" Jesus made during his earthly ministry We want to explore is how to fit my "shadow" and/or the church's "shadow" inside of His

We want people to see Christ not me To be in somethings shadow, it has to be bigger than me The closer I am to the object the better chance I have to hide in its shadow Thus it would make sense that if we want to reach people the way Jesus did, then we should look his ministry Make his ministry our focal point Match what we are doing as closely as we can to what he did

Last week we discussed doing what Jesus did

This week we are going to talk about what Jesus saw

What did Jesus See?

When he saw the crowds, they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd

What I see goes a along way toward my actions

How What We See Impacts Us If food does not look appetizing then odds are I won't eat it 70% of you opinion about a person comes from what you see "You never get a second chance to make a first impression" Seeing feeds our emotions (fear, joy, disgust, anger)

The first thing Jesus saw was people The verse says he saw the crowds

> The verse says crowds but do not loose "sight" that the crowd was made up of people

> > Jesus saw people not sin! Homosexual, Adulterer, Liar, Thief, Gossip, Drunkard

But keep in mind he was there to die for that sin so they could have a way out Have you ever noticed when Jesus talked about sin it was ALWAYS a passing thought on the way to forgiveness

Jesus saw them for what they were (harassed and helpless)

Harassed: feeling or looking strained through having too many demands made on one

Helpless: Unable to defend oneself or to act without help

Victim: a person harmed, injured, or killed as a result of a crime, accident, or other event or action

Jesus Never Saw Problems Just People

- Sinful: wicked and immoral; committing or characterized by the committing of sins
- Sinner: a person who transgresses against divine law by committing an immoral act or acts
- A sinful person warrants judgement (from God) because they are characterized by sin
- A sinner is somebody that has sinned but they are worth redeeming

How we the church talk about and pray about people tells the world exactly what we see But the things that come out of a person's mouth come from the heart, and these defile them.

Matthew 15:18

Once He was able to see what they were He was able to identify what they needed

Jesus Never Saw Problems Just People

To the tax collector stuck in a tree... Let's have dinner

To the woman caught in adultery... Neither do I condemn you

To the harassed and helpless victims of the human condition we call sin ... They need a shepherd

Luke 19:10 For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.

The Picture of a Shepherd

The Shepherd values the sheep (A shepherd with no sheep is unemployed.... no purpose)

The Shepherd lives with the sheep

The Shepherd tends to the sheep's needs (Still Waters, Green Pastures, Protection)

The Shepherd guides, and corrects the sheep (Rod, Staff)

The Shepherd "gives" their life for the sheep (In Death and Through Life)

Are we living in His Shadow?
