The Relationship --- Our Father We have Bad Father Images Not a tyrant Not the boogie man Not somebody interested is seeing you fail Not somebody that is waiting for the moment to say I told you so.

Lord Teach Us **The Location --- In Heaven** We will see the phrase "Father in Heaven" a lot in this series We are not praying to an earthly power We are praying to a being that is well beyond our understanding This gets complicated for us because we are such physical beings to Tray

Jesus wants us to know that while we may not physically see him, he is present and listening

Hallowed: greatly revered or respected

And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

Lord Teach Us **Don't Try to Impress Mankind** They pray to be seen Jesus called them hypocrites because they are not sincere in their approach The lesson is not that we should not pray in public **Public prayer is an extension** of private prayer to Tray

Do try to impress God God is not impressed with long prayers and big words He called it babbling He also called people praying in that fashion pagans (Godless)

to Tray

God as Father Father, who is unseen Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you

Father knows what you need before you ask him

When we approach God in prayer we need to approach him as a child would approach a loving Father
