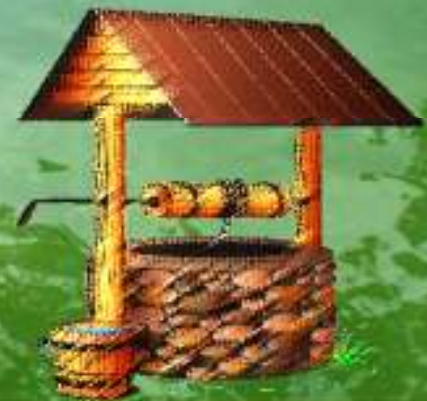
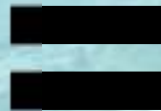




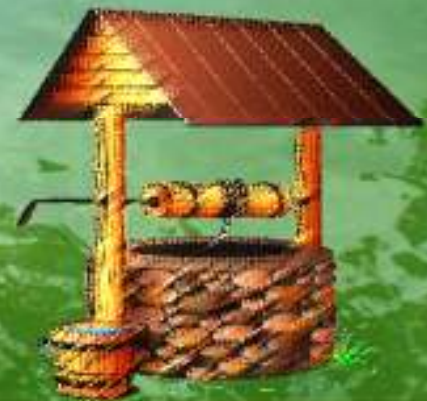

# **How did Jesus Approach?**

**He started by allowing her to meet one on His needs**

**It was a need she could meet**

**It engaged her in a  
non threatening  
way**



# **He Listened!**

**She could have just got the water for him and went about her business.**

**Instead she chose to start up a conversation**

**He brought her face to face with her visible issue**



**He did not beat her  
over the head with it**

**He did not judge her**

**He did not ignore it**

**But he understood her issue  
was not sexual**

**Lonely**



## **He pointed her to Him**

**He kept driving the conversation back to Himself**

**“Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.”**
