



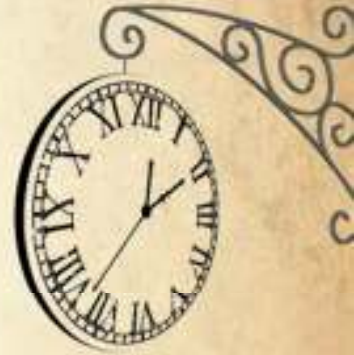


It's About Time!

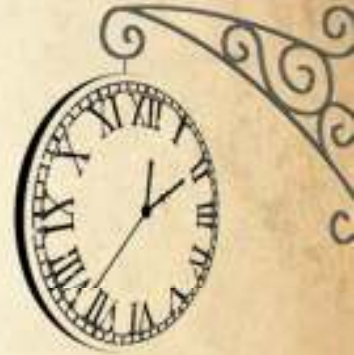

rather, serve one another humbly in love.**

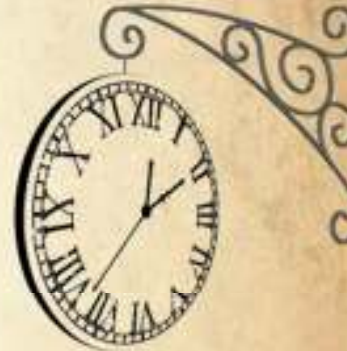

1 Corinthians 12:12-14



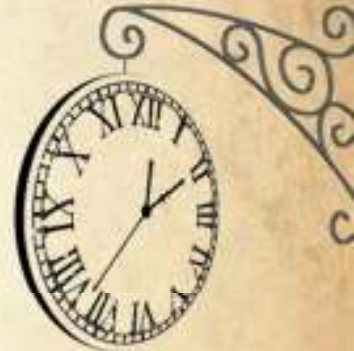
Body of Believers

Both need all their parts to be complete

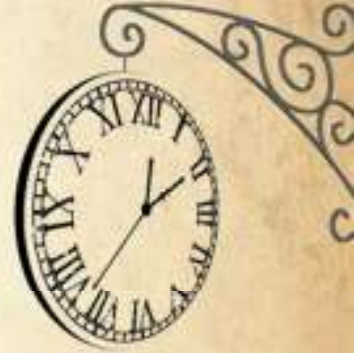
In both a band and in a body their maybe more prominent parts but not more important parts

Production of vitamin D

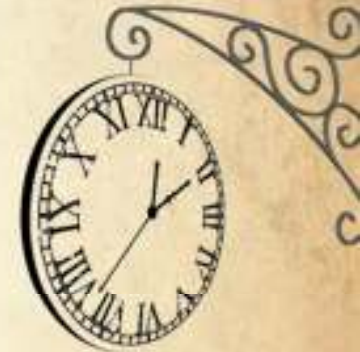

Acts Chapter 2:42-47 was all about body building

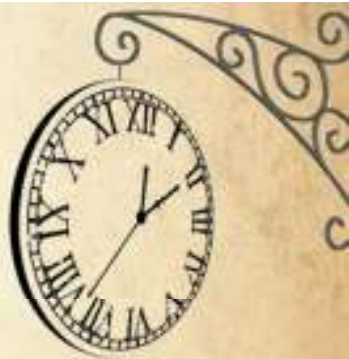


When we see the early church in Acts 2, they are about serving one another not filling positions

They were no longer living as individuals they were indeed a body.





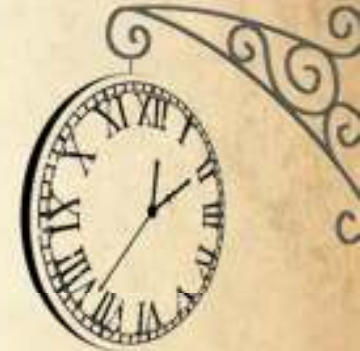

Not about how to do effective outreach

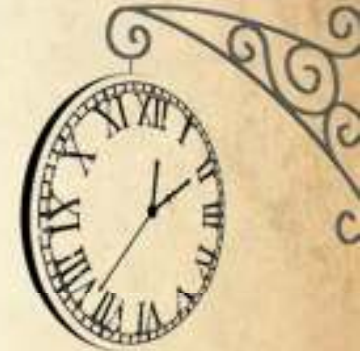
**Not about a crash course in how to
