The first six actions says God HATES!


The seventh says God finds it DETESTABLE!

The more items I add from the left and subtract from the right the more divisive the church becomes

But the more items I add from right and subtract from the left the more unified the church becomes

That is why God finds this last one so detestable because it is the product of all the others

Understanding Divisiveness

A person who stirs up conflict in the community

In the body of believers there are no divisive issues just divisive people

Divisive is not the same as Disagreement (Philippians 4:2-3) I plead with Euodia, and I plead with Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you, my true companion, help these women since they have contended at my side in the cause of the gospel, along with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life.

Understanding Divisiveness

Paul saw both as valuable contributors in the ministry

Notice he did not tell them they had to agree but instead have a mind of the Lord in their disagreement

Which means don't allow a difference of opinion to become divisive

There will always be disagreements in the church

Disagree vs Divisive

Often our disagreements are good things because

They force us to listen to the other person and thus we grow as people

They stop us from making rushed and reactive decisions that would hurt the body

They require us to pray and study to seek God's guidance

They provide us new ideas that none of us ever thought of before.

Remember while disagreements are not divisive, all disagreements have the potential to become divisive

Being Divisive Stirring up conflict in the body

Constant conflict is the mark of a divisive person

Proverbs 6:14 Proverbs 10:12 Proverbs 15:18

Proverbs 28:25 Proverbs 29:22

Like disagreements conflict in the church is Unavoidable!

Conflict

Left undealt with conflict will create divisiveness in the body

You should know that if there is conflict and there will be then at some point there must be confrontation

We define confront as a hostile or argumentative meeting or situation between opposing parties

This is a definition of confront, however, there is a more basic definition: to cause to meet, bring face-to-face or to meet face-to-face

Confrontation

The idea of confrontation is not so we can argue or duke it out, we are seeking resolution

If you manage to find a way to deal with conflict that does not involve confrontation, then you are a better man than Jesus

Even when it was time for him to deal with the sin conflict, he came face to face

Conflict

Not all conflict it equal

For Paul, In this both situations revolved around actions that were detrimental to the body

When Solomon discusses the issues, he cites a much different source for conflict

In these issues the person is not seeking the health of the body, instead they are seeking gain for themselves or to call attention to themself

But avoid foolish controversies and genealogies and arguments and quarrels about the law, because these are unprofitable and useless. Warn a divisive person once, and then warn them a second time. After that, have nothing to do with them. You may be sure that such people are warped and sinful; they are self-condemned.

Titus 3:9-11

Paul starts by making sure you are again not just dealing with just opinions

He then makes a simple statement, DON'T ARGUE with them (Avoid)

He references foolish controversies and genealogies and arguments and quarrels about the law

He calls this kind of chatter unprofitable and useless

These are things we may disagree on but really it boils down to opinions

Warn a divisive person once, and then warn them a second time. After that, have nothing to do with them.

For individuals that will not move on its best to have them move on

That sounds so unloving but notice Paul says you should let them know this in not an issue we are going to battle about

When you tell once/twice you are not telling them off, you are approaching them in love

You may be sure that such people are warped and sinful; they are self-condemned. (See the Math Problem?)

You need to know there is no solution for the conflict because they are not interested in resolution unless it results in total surrender

Reality they desire conflict even if it is divisive
