

OBEDIENCE

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished. Therefore, anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

OBEDIENCE

Coupled with accountability and responsibility to use that information in our lives to be more like Christ



Remembering the accountability and responsibility must be wrapped in mercy and grace for when obedience is not achieved.

But even mercy and grace cannot allow us to ignore obedience to God's commands.

WHAT TO TEACH?

Jesus said disciple making teaching should be focused on his commands that he shared with his disciples.

What are the "commands" of Jesus?

Keep in mind we only have the things that were written down. (John 21:25)

KEEPING THE COMMANDS

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second

is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Matthew 22:36-38



He blended Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18 and in so doing he summarized all 10 commandments given to Moses plus all the prophets

However, at the same time he laid a simple foundation for what it means to be an obedient Christ following disciple

KEEPING THE COMMANDS

Make your relationship with God the priority of your life -- Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.

in heaven.


Matthew 5:16
