1 Timothy 3:1

Aspire: Direct one's hopes or ambitions towards achieving something.

Desire: A strong feeling of wanting to have something or wishing for something to happen.

Leadership vs Management

Focus: Leadership zeros in on the "why" and "what," while management tackles the "how."


Vision: Leaders set the course and direction. Managers execute and implement the plans to get there.

Time Horizon: Leadership takes a long-term perspective, whereas management concentrates on short-term objectives.

Leadership vs Management

Innovation vs. Efficiency: Leadership fosters creativity and encourages new ideas. In contrast, management prioritizes efficiency and streamlining operations.

People: Leaders inspire and motivate their teams. Managers, on the other hand, are more concerned with coordination and organization.



Team vs Committee

Called leadership always leads to teamwork but never a committee

"Faced with the size and scope of the project Jesus refused to be a solo minister"


The Importance of Teams

They also work hard to develop new team members and future leaders




Dictatorship vs Leadership

To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.

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The Called Leader -- Shepherd


The shepherd is in charge
