The Fellowship Offering

The meat of their fellowship offering of thanksgiving must be eaten on the day it is offered; they must leave none of it till morning.

It is not consumed entirely **Leviticus 7:15**
on the altar, but becomes a meal between
God, the priest, and the worshiper

It's not about paying a debt, but about
celebrating relationship

It was given as a freewill expression of
joy and voluntary devotion

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***The Fellowship Offering
(Leviticus 3:1-5)***

The Fellowship Offering

It symbolized peace with God

Often offered after atonement was made.

(1 Kings 3:15)

It could also be mixed with a Grain Offering *(Leviticus 7:12-13)*

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Romans 5:1

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The Fellowship Offering

Sacrifice fellowship offerings there, eating them and rejoicing in the presence of the LORD your God.

Deuteronomy 27:7

It was a feast of joy, not a fast of sorrow

It wasn't commanded; it was invited

It celebrated shared fellowship

This table represented restored relationship and community

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The Altar Moment

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:6–7

“You don’t have to fight for My favor, just come and sit at My table.”

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Jesus is Our Fellowship Offering

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

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Jesus is Our Fellowship Offering

The cross became the table where enemies were made friends

Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

about a meal in the moment, it was a
glimpse of a greater feast still to come
